Class lists will be distributed via Compass next Friday, that will outline your child's classmates and teacher for 2018. Teaching staff have worked on these lists over three weeks to find the best combination of needs, personalities and friendships that allow for positive and engaging learning environments for every student in the school. As per the class formation policy, appeals can be made in writing until Tuesday December 19th, however it is important to note that an appeal will not automatically mean a change in outcome.

## 2018 BUILDING WORKS

Anyone who has visited the school grounds over the last two weeks will have noticed a large installation of temporary fencing across our school yard! This is a truck passageway, to ensure children's safety while our 2018 relocatable building is put in place. The rapid growth of our amazing school means that we are running out of space for our delightful kiddies and relocatable buildings are a quick way for the Department of Education to respond to our growth. Unfortunately this relocatable building position will require some trees to be cut down, but we have managed to negotiate with the builders so the most mature trees will remain. As our growth has increased significantly since August (when the buildings are first allocated), we will receive another relocatable that should be ready for learners in February 2018.

I am super excited to announce that Brunswick North West Primary School was successful in receiving a \$200,000 Inclusive Schools Fund grant for our Sensory Playground! The sensory playground is aimed to provide students with a range of sensory experiences that complement our existing woodlands and bush play area. The initial design of this playground was informed by students within the school and families of students with additional sensory needs and was based off the playground at Canberra's Arboretum. I thank all the students and families who put so much effort into their design ideas and feedback. I also want to thank Nicole Butler for her support over 12 months of grant writing and endless questions from me! Further design work and the build of this playground will occur in 2018 and I will be sure to keep you updated with the progress.

## GRADE 6 GRADUATION

Last Tuesday evening our Grade 6 cohort graduated from primary school in style! The evening started with a disco dance party and dinner and finished up with each of the graduates reading a speech to a crowd of families and loved ones so big that we had people spilling out of the MPR!

It was so lovely to hear each student share a reflection of their time at primary school and I was exceptionally proud at the speaking ability of many of our students during an emotional evening (the students certainly did much better than me - I was a teary mess during my speech!)

Thank you to all the students, families and teachers who helped set up and attended the graduation evening - your support of our graduating class was wonderful to see.

## 2018 SCHOOL FEES

At BNW, we try to limit additional costs to families, however every two years our Finance Committee, in consultation with School Council, analyses our school fee structure to see if it adequately meets the educational needs of our students. School Council has approved an increase to 2018's school fees from \$340 to \$400 per student per year (with a small additional cost for Grade 6 students). Our School Fees cover costs such as stationery, subject materials, excursions, our Garden Education program, ICT resources and much more, and is significantly less than many other schools in our local area. We trust that the school community will find huge value and benefit from this increase in school fees. More information around how school fees are used and varied payment options will be coming out on Compass soon, but please don't hesitate to contact the school if you have any questions or concerns.

## CSEF: CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) is provided by the Victorian Government to ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) administers the CSEF to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

Although administratively the fund is received through the school, the full amount is intended for the benefit of the eligible student.

Schools are required to use the CSEF payment for expenses relating to camps, sport and/or excursions for the benefit of the eligible student.

Some common examples of school-organised programs for which the CSEF payment may be used include:

- School camps/trips
- Swimming and other school-organised sporting programs.
- Outdoor education programs.
- Excursions/incursions

The CSEF payment cannot be used towards voluntary school charges, nor towards books, stationery, school uniforms, before/after school care, music lessons, locker hire, classroom/homework materials, graduations/formals, or other expenses unrelated to camps, sports or excursions.

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
- Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- Submit an application to the school by the due date.

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one or two.

The amount payable for primary and secondary students is:

- \$125 for Primary school students.
- \$225 for Secondary school students.

CSEF payments are made directly to schools from March onwards each year.

The CSEF program closes on 30 June each year.
