A stick lying on the ground looking like it's not being used in an existing cubby...

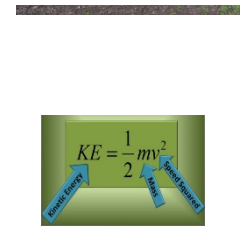
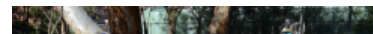


Usually means it is a stick lying on the ground NOT being used in an existing cubby. Use it to make something incredible
